



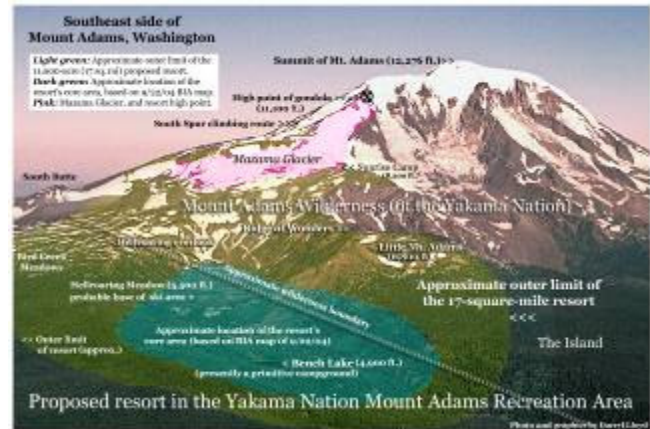
## Wild Winters & Wild Creatures Film Night
